Developing Security Policies & Procedures

The development of policies and procedures is one of the most important functions of a security management team yet it often is also one of the most procrastinated and dreaded tasks. This session will give basic structure, processes and legal considerations when developing, revising or updating your company's self-imposed standards.

Topics include:

- **Making the case for a manual** Before we can create and document policies and procedures, we need to be able to understand their value. Learn how a well-written manual protects the company, its assets, your department, employees, and you.
- **Context and purpose** There are different types of policies, procedures, manuals and handbooks. Sort them all out and decide which one works for your department and how it will be used and updated.
- **Building your manual** Outline, organize, delegate and compile your very own manual. We will lay it all out and provide templates and guides to help you through it.
- **Training manual** Learn how a training manual differs from a policy manual. We will outline the first step to creating an outstanding training program.
- **Emergency procedures** Contingency plans are so different from our policies and procedures, we give them their own manual. They also need to be properly organized, written, reviewed and practiced.
- **Post orders and job descriptions** These important tools protect us, provide guidance and training, and are vital to our operation. We will outline and write these as well.
- **Arrest, detention and handcuffing** This is an area that can get us into trouble if we do not follow our own policies. Learn how to develop legal and effective policies on use of force that will ensure consistency and keep the lawyers happy.

Who should attend: Department heads and policy writers from Security, Surveillance, HR, Legal, and any other manager responsible for policy development.

Learning objectives: Attendees will be able to develop, document and implement policies and procedures and learn their importance in training, personnel management, and litigation.

Managing & Preventing Prostitution in Gaming Environments

Statutory laws, ordinances and regulatory requirements typically require that prostitution be aggressively prevented and prohibited in gaming environments. Prostitution activity in gaming environments is an ongoing issue that requires attention and knowledge in order to effectively deter and limit this negative activity. This session taught by a retired undercover Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Sergeant is both informative and educational on this important topic.

Topics include:

- **Understanding the culture of prostitution** Having a fundamental understanding of how prostitution works, including solicitation, pimps, common terms and vocabulary, will assist in the overall prevention of prostitution. The game "Pimp and Prostitute Rules and Regulations" will also be covered.
- **Criminal aspects of prostitution in casinos** The elements of the crimes involving prostitution and its associated crimes, including Trick Rolls, Grope & Grabs, larceny crimes and victimization, will be discussed. The growing problems associated with child prostitution and escort services in gaming environments will also be covered.
- **Techniques in deterring prostitution** Proactive enforcement techniques, such as trespassing, interrupting the solicitation act, presence and deterrence will be presented, as well as the "John" sting and undercover operations.
- **Social and media issues** The effects of HIV and other STDs, social media use in prostitution, and the negative effects of press reports regarding prostitution in casinos will also be discussed.

Who should attend: Security and surveillance professionals, police officers and detectives, prosecutors, community organizations and social service workers.

Learning objectives: Attendees will take away a clear understanding of the pimp and prostitute rules, regulations, ranks and language, as well as being able to identify child victims of prostitution and escorts. They will also know how to investigate victims of trick rolls and grope & grabs, how to manage the demand side "Johns", and the effects of HIV and prostitution.
