ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT

Academic Advising

unlv.edu/advising

UNLV has 12 academic advising centers on campus, here to support students through their academic journey: Academic Success Center (advises exploring majors & pathways), Business, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Health Sciences, Honors, Hospitality, Liberal Arts, Sciences, Urban Affairs, and Pre-Professional Advising. Students are encouraged to schedule at least one academic advising appointment during the fall and spring semesters. Establishing a relationship with an academic advisor ensures that students meet their specific degree requirements and accomplish their personal academic goals.

Academic Success Center

The Academic Success Center (ASC) is a resource hub that welcomes, guides, and supports students throughout their academic journeys. The ASC can help students explore and choose a major and register for classes, including a first-year seminar. They offer various services for student success, including tutoring, academic success coaching, and a Math Bridge program to help students gain skills and confidence in college-level math.

University Libraries

The university libraries are a hub for student discovery, creativity, learning, and scholarship. The primary and largest library at UNLV is Lied Library. As the campus's physical and intellectual center, it boasts over 2,500 study spaces, computer workstations, and group study rooms to support student learning. Students can also access the Makerspace & Multimedia Production Studios, multidisciplinary spaces dedicated to emerging technology where students can experiment and create. Four additional branch libraries provide access to specialized materials and offer research assistance and resources on architecture, medicine, music, and teacher development.

Writing Center

The Writing Center offers students free one-on-one or group consultations working on academic, professional, or personal writing projects at any stage of the writing process – from first ideas to polished drafts. Notification of tuition and fees will be sent via email to your student's Rebelmail account. They can view their current account balance by logging in to their MyUNLV account at my.unlv.edu.

Students wishing to visit the Cashiering & Student Accounts Office in person should first join the QLess virtual line by texting **CASHIERINGQ** to **702-710-0905** or visiting <u>unlv.edu/rebelq</u>. Questions can also be submitted online using the Rebel Success Hub at <u>unlv.today/service</u>. The Cashiering & Student Accounts Office accepts the following forms of payment:

Credit or Debit Card

- Pay online with a credit or debit card by logging in to their MyUNLV account
- Pay in person with a credit or debit card
- Pay by faxing a completed Credit Card Authorization Form

Cash

Cash payments are not recommended but can be made at the Cashiering & Student Accounts Office.

Check, Cashier's Check, or Money Order

Check, Cashier's Check, or Money Order Payments can be made by check, cashier's check, or money order through the Cashiering & Student Accounts Office or a drop box located on the first floor of the Student Services Complex, Building A. All forms of payment should be made payable to the Board of Regents and include the NSHE Student ID Number on the front.

Payment Plans

Payment plans become available once your student registers for classes. In MyUNLV, select My Account and Enroll in a Payment Plan. For important tuition payment deadlines, please visit <u>unlv.edu/cashiering/pay</u>.

Top Things You Should Know about Paying for College

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Must apply annually at studentaid.gov
- Available on October 1
- View important dates and deadlines at unlv.today/deadlines

Alternate Need Form

- Must apply annually at unlv.edu/finaid/daca
- Available to non-FAFSA eligible students on October 1
- View important dates and deadlines at unlv.today/deadlines

Financial Aid Notification

- Students should check their MyUNLV account regularly
- Required information in the MyUNLV To-Do List must be submitted my.unly.edu

Paying the Bill

- After registering for classes, students can check their account balance and review charges in MyUNLV
- Calculate any room and board charges, if not yet applied
- Compare the balance to what has been offered in financial aid and scholarships
- Decide together if any federal loans need to be accepted <u>unlv.edu/cashiering</u>

Scholarships

- Grants and scholarships will automatically be accepted

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Requirements

Students must:

- Meet minimum cumulative grade point average of at least a 2.0
- Complete at least 68% of the cumulative credit hours attempted
- Complete degree program within the maximum time frame of credit hours allowed unlv.edu/finaid/checklist/after-sap

Accepting Federal Loans

- Additional funding may be acquired through federal student loans
- Students will need to check the Financial Aid tile in their MyUNLV account for awards and action items unlv.edu/finaid/faq-students
- Parents may apply for a Parent PLUS Loan

Financial Aid Disbursement

 Will be applied toward student account balances no earlier than ten days before the start of the semester unlv.edu/finaid/checklist/after-disbursement

Census Date

- Class schedules need to be finalized by this date
- Financial aid is based on the number of credits students are enrolled in at this time <u>unlv.edu/finaid/checklist/census</u>
- Enrollment reductions can result in balances due

Last Day to Pay

- After the last day to pay, the account balance will incur late penalties

SUPPORT SERVICES

The Intersection

Available to all students, The Intersection serves as an academic resource center for students seeking information and assistance on a variety of topics that reflect the challenges they encounter in their academic life. It is a multicultural center that focuses on demystifying the college experience for self-identified first-generation students and students of color.

Center for Academic Enrichment & Outreach

The Center for Academic Enrichment & Outreach offers federally-funded programs that deliver services designed to motivate and support students from diverse backgrounds to pursue a college degree. They provide eligible students with various support services to help them achieve their educational goals, including tutoring, mentoring, academic and career counseling, and undergraduate research. All services are free to qualified students. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, and space is limited.

Disability Resource Center

Meal Plans

Delicious, well-balanced, and nutritious meals are available at convenient locations throughout campus. All students living on campus are required to select one of the campus meal plans. Students who commute to campus may also opt to purchase a meal plan.

Meal plans are offered on a semester basis and include meals at the Dining Commons and Dining Dollars that can be used at any of the 17 dining locations on campus. On-campus plans are purchased when students register for housing. Students living off campus can also purchase meal plans at any time online or at the RebelCard Services Office in the Student Union.

Students can add Dining Dollars to their RebelCard at any time. For every \$100 purchase, they'll receive an additional \$10! Students can purchase Dining Dollars online or at the RebelCard Services office in the Student Union.

CAMPUS RECREATION & WELLNESS

Student Recreation & Wellness Center

The Student Recreation & Wellness Center (SRWC) is home to both Campus Recreational Services and the Student Health Center. Students registered for four or more credits are eligible to use the services offered at the SRWC. Students registered for less than four credits may purchase a membership for \$25 per month.

Campus Recreational Services

Campus Recreational Services offers activity space for students to exercise, dance, swim, or just relax. Students can also participate in various recreational sports. These include intramural sports such as basketball, outdoor soccer, flag football, and volleyball and club sports such as bowling, esports, ice hockey, and wrestling. Additionally, the SRWC houses the Bike Shop, which provides repair services, workshops, and mountain bike rentals.

Outdoor Adventures

The UNLV Wellness Zone is an integrated wellness resource that offers targeted wellness programming and assessments, certified peer education training, personal training, and free wellness supplies and resources. A professional wellness educator is available to answer health and wellness-related questions, and there's a relaxation room where students can de-stress using the free automated massage chairs. The Wellness Zone also provides a variety of inclusive safer-sex supplies, health education workshops and presentations, menstrual products, and other essentials at no cost to students.

The Student Health Center is a nationally accredited health center that provides comprehensive, essential medical and mental health services on an outpatient basis. There is no office visit charge, and same-day appointments are usually available. Appointments can be made by calling **702-895-3370**. Services available include:

- Treatment of various illnesses and injuries
- Wellness exams and screenings for men and women, including complete physical exams and pap smears
- Immunizations and vaccinations
 - Tetanus-diphtheria (Td); Measles, Mumps, & Rubella (MMR); Meningitis; Hepatitis; and more
 - Free flu vaccines
 - Free COVID-19 vaccinations and boosters
- Immediate first aid and blood pressure checks
- Early detection and ongoing care of chronic illnesses
- Basic vision screening
- Smoking cessation assistance
- Sports medicine clinics
- Gynecology clinics
- Contraceptive evaluation and maintenance
- Pregnancy testing
- Health information and health education programs
- On-site licensed accredited clinical laboratory offering a variety of lab tests with a health care provider's order
- On-site licensed pharmacy offering standard prescription and nonprescription medications and supplies, including free thermometers and free at-home COVID-19 tests

Note: All medical records are confidential. Information will not be released to anyone without the student's written consent except as required by law or in a life-threatening emergency. Students under the age of 18, by Nevada State Law, are minors and must have signed and notarized parental consent and release to obtain medical care. This must be on file at the Student Health Center before care is given, except in the case of an emergency. These forms are available upon request.

The Care Center

Students can receive individual support to assist them in working through feelings, identifying needs, and making decisions. Counseling & Psychological Services

Pursuing a university education can be exciting, challenging, and sometimes highly stressful. Social and personal concerns can interfere with students' academic work and emotional well-being. Student Counseling & Psychological Services (CAPS) is committed to helping students benefit fully from their college experience at UNLV. CAPS is accredited by the International Accreditation of Counseling Services (IACS) and offers in-person and telehealth services. Our psychologists, counselors, behavioral health provider, and psychiatrist specialize in dealing with the problems commonly experienced by college students of all ages and backgrounds. We collaborate with students to increase self-understanding and develop the skills necessary to overcome personal concerns.

Confidential services offered to assist students in managing the adjustment demands and personal challenges of college include:

- Single sessions and brief consultations
- Individual, group, and couples counseling
- Crisis assessment and intervention
- Psychological assessment and testing
- Drug and alcohol use assessment and treatment
- Eating disorder assessment and treatment
- Medication evaluation and management
- Referrals to community health care providers when necessary

All currently enrolled UNLV students who have paid their Student Health and Mental Health Fees are eligible for confidential counseling services. Initial consultation appointments are available during office hours, Monday through Thursday from 8am–5pm and Fridays from 9am–5pm.

A crisis counselor is available during operating hours for situations that need immediate attention. After-hours phone crisis services are available by calling the CAPS main number **702-895-3627** and selecting the prompt to speak with a crisis counselor.



SAFETY

University Police Services

University Police Services (UPD) is dedicated to providing protection and service to the university community by ensuring a safe and secure environment for a positive social and educational experience. UPD is a full-service law enforcement agency operating patrol and dispatch services 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, including police, emergency management, and other safety services.

RebelSAFE

The official mobile safety app of UNLV, *RebelSAFE*, provides UNLV students with many features to keep themselves safe. These include real-time chats with police services dispatch, requests for Rebel Rides evening security escorts and shuttles, anonymous crime tip submission, and more. It is also recommended that parents and guardians download the app to receive *RebelSAFE* Alerts, an emergency notification system used for incidents that present an imminent threat to life, health, or safety to the UNLV community. Alert messages provide information and instructions to protect yourself during an emergency. Students are automatically enrolled in this system upon registration.

Rebel Rides Security Escorts

Student Cadets provide walking and golf cart escort services for students to and from any campus location during the evening hours. This service is based on availability.

Emergency Call Boxes

UPD monitors a network of **RebelSAFE** emergency phones throughout campus, illuminated by a blue light and equipped with a 360-degree surveillance camera. They can be used to request help, report a crime in progress, report suspicious activities, request a Rebel Rides shuttle, or for any other emergency. Emergency calls from these phones will connect directly to University Police Dispatch or broadcast **RebelSAFE** Alerts via public address speakers.

Self-Defense Classes

Free self-defense classes are available to provide students with the basic skills to escape an attacker and teach them how to avoid dangerous situations whenever possible. The Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects student records privacy and disclosure rights. In compliance with FERPA, UNLV does not disclose personally identifiable information in student education records, except when authorized by law. Parents and guardians requesting access to student academic and financial records may only do so after the student has permitted them through a third-party release.

Title IX Compliance




