UNLV Consent Policy

- Both people are fully conscious and sober and/or not under the influence of any controlled substance.
- Both are equally free to act. If a person is pinned down or physically restrained, they are not free to act.
- Both people communicate a positive and sincere desire, this means there can be no blackmail, coercion, nagging, convincing, etc.
- Both people are clear about their intentions.

What can I do?

- Speak up if someone's putting down women/men/transgender individuals.
- Offer to drive someone home from a party.
- Keep track of your friends and what they are drinking, especially if the drink wasn't mixed in front of them.
- Pair up with your friends at parties to keep an eye on each other.

HOW DO I HELP THE PERSON?

Be patient.

Don't suggest retaliation.

Know available resources.

Don't pry.

Tell the victim it is not their fault.

Encourage them to report.

Believe them.

Listen.

Medical Services

UNLV Student Health Center 702-895-3370

The Student Health Center offers a range of services for persons affected by sexual assault and dating violence including treatment of injuries, emergency contraception and pregnancy testing. The Student Health Center does not perform forensic (“rape kits”) examinations; those are only done at UMC.

University Medical Center (UMC) 702-383-2000

UMC is the only hospital that administers rape kits, and it’s free. The evidence collected from a rape kit will be necessary if you decide to press charges. If you have been sexually assaulted, PLEASE DO NOT: bathe, shower, douche, change clothes, smoke, or brush your teeth until you have spoken with a nurse. If you changed clothes, bring the clothes you were wearing in a paper bag or pillow case to the hospital with you. You may still seek medical care if you have done any of these things.

Reporting the Crime

If you are a survivor of sexual assault, dating violence, or stalking, you have the choice to report these crimes to law enforcement and or the departments listed below. They can investigate and pursue action against perpetrators. In an emergency, dial 911 to contact local law enforcement.
