THE FACTS

Dates: June 10 through June 30, 2013.

Program: The William F. Harrah College of Hotel Administration at UNLV grants 6 upper-division credit hours for the 2 courses offered in this three-week study abroad program (plus web classes before and after the trip). Classes meet at the Vatel Hotel School in Martigny, Switzerland four days per week. Extended travel can occur on long weekends.

Location: Martigny is located on the Rhone elbow in the Lower Valais and is known for its cultural-historical heritage, Mediterranean flair and tasty gastronomy. Surrounded by vineyards and orchards, it has a wide range of outstanding restaurants. With a history that stretches back two thousand years, the Celtic tribes, the Romans and Napoleon's troupes have left behind traces. There is a restored amphitheater, Roman thermal baths, temples and living quarters that can be admired in Martigny today.

People: The Summer Studies in Switzerland Program is open to UNLV Hotel College students.

Cost: \$3300 for rooms and breakfast at the School, lunch on class days, selected dinners and motor coach transportation. Airfare, Eurail pass, tuition, lab fees and the UNLV mandatory health insurance costs are not included. The estimated in state tuition cost of \$1200 plus incidental fees, a \$85 lab fee for the Culture & Cuisine class and \$80 health insurance is payable to the UNLV Board of Regents.

GENERAL INFORMATION

For a truly unique summer experience, learn and live with the William F. Harrah College of Hotel Administration's summer school in Martigny, Switzerland. Experience Swiss and European hospitality during a three-week summer session in the beautiful Swiss Alps nestled in the center of Europe in the Rhone Valley.

The program is open to hospitality students throughout North America as well as UNLV. The program gives students an educational experience they can obtain in no other way. Credit for the three-week summer session is granted by UNLV.

The classes will meet four days per week in Martigny. Long weekends will permit guided and independent travel to hotels, attractions and restaurants in such destinations as Paris, the Riviera, Florence, Venice, Rome, and, of course, Switzerland.

ACCOMMODATIONS

Students will be housed in double occupancy rooms at the Vatel Hotel School). Rooms are double occupancy and are nicely appointed with private bathrooms.

DINING

Continental breakfast is provided daily. Lunch and some dinners are provided on class days. Experience has shown that students prefer to find their own dining spots on evenings and weekends when they may well be off campus or in other countries. Martigny and nearby Montreux offer many dining experiences.

NOT INCLUDED

Not included in the program fee is the approximate cost of \$1200 in tuition plus fees and a \$85 lab fee for the Culture & Cuisine class, round trip airfare to Switzerland, Eurail pass, evening dinners, lunch on non-class days, and some accommodations when away from Martigny. You may also consider purchasing travel insurance at an additional cost.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURE


- Completed application and \$500 deposit will be accepted until space is filled (30 students total).

COURSE OFFERINGS

TCA 449 - International Tourism (3 credits)

Study of international travel and tourism. Focuses on the economic, social, political, and environmental considerations of international tourism management and development. Prereq: Upper-division standing; fulfills International requirement. FAB 333 – Culture and Cuisine (3 credits)

Explores foods and food ways of various cultural/ethnic groups. Considers origin and migration of foods and customs throughout the world. Studies food's relationship to cultural groups, geographical location, social practices and economic well-being. Analyzes impact of multiple cultures on foods, food preparation, and food ways in the U.S. Lab fees required. Prerequisites: ENG102; fulfills University Multicultural requirement.
