Gol f-a-Thon - One for the Record Books



At 7:00am on May 1st 2009 Christopher Cain, (Director of the PGA Golf Management Program) and Brian Esposito (Founder of Par For The Cure) hit their first shots of the day. Twelve hours and 1068 holes later the two men completed a grueling marathon of golf that would break a normal human being. Their feat is positioned to establish a Guinness World Record for the most holes played by a tandem in twelve hours. Averaging just under a minute and a half per hole (85 seconds) they both played over 500 holes each. Esposito completed 501 holes, and Cain completed 567 holes and established a record for the most holes played by an individual in 12 hours.

The purpose of their efforts was to raise awareness for Par For The Cure, dedicated to raise funds for breast cancer research, and for the PGA Golf Management program at UNLV. The event was a great success raising nearly \$8,000 in donations.

The event was also held in conjunction with a Play Golf America Day, coordinated by local PGA professionals and PGA Golf Management students.

Those in attendance got to witness history being made and enjoyed a funfilled day of activities. The day included a Demo Day, Long Drive Competition, and featured a Restaurant Row which showcased some of the area's finest food establishments.
