- Maintain a professional relationship with your academic advisor by arriving on time, being prepared for your appointments and calling if you need to reschedule.
- Take responsibility for your academic success by utilizing the tools provided. Examples include undergraduate catalogues, degree sheets, college and university websites, and academic calendars.
- Maintain a file with relevant academic materials and follow through with your academic advisor's recommendations.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION ADVISING CENTER

Our team of academic advisors is here to help students chart a course for success. Advisors will help you plan a sequence of courses to design a well-balanced schedule, understand how to apply transfer credits, learn more about university policies and procedures, and efficiently complete your degree.

First Year:

- Attend a New Student Orientation Session, where you will be advised and register for classes
- Meet with your advisor each semester and discuss your goals, interests and concerns
- Have an understanding of general education courses and requirements
- Set a tentative plan with your advisor for classes each semester/year
- Build a balanced schedule to include your school and outside responsibilities
- Review course restrictions and prerequisites and enroll for classes
- Utilize campus resources
- Check RebelMail & WebCampus regularly
- Complete remedial classes
- Take and pass PPST/PRAXIS I exam

Second Year:

- Continue to meet with your advisor each semester
- Access your Academic Advisement Report (Degree Audit) via MyUNLV
- Complete General Education requirements
- Begin checking the Advising and Field Experience website regularly:

- Attend Rebels R.I.S.E. event in the Fall
- Check RebelMail and WebCampus regularly

Third Year:

- Continue to meet with advisor each semester
- Access your Academic Advisement Report (Degree Audit) via MyUNLV
- Discuss upcoming Field Experience courses, requirements, and apply online by deadline
- Apply for full admission, if required
- Assess your academic standing and progress toward graduation
- Explore Graduate Programs & their requirements
- Begin discussing career goals with your advisor
- Check RebelMail and WebCampus regularly

Fourth Year:

- Apply for graduation
- Meet with your advisor for final verification
- Take PRAXIS II exam for teacher licensure programs
- Review teacher licensure application checklist on the Nevada Department of Education website: www.doe.nv.gov
- Prepare for life after graduation: Update resume, Complete application to Graduate School (if appropriate), learn about interviewing skills and perform career searches
- Check RebelMail and Web Campus regularly
