Students majoring in Hospitality Management have the option to take a generalist approach by completing the Hospitality Electives section of their degree worksheet with courses of their own selection.

A concentration is not required, however, students wishing to focus their studies may do so by selecting one of the approved concentrations. Concentration courses will fulfill the Hospitality College Electives section and must be completed with a 'C' or better grade.

Declaring a concentration can take place any time after the student has been admitted to the Harrah College of Hospitality. It is necessary to schedule an appointment with an academic advisor to declare a concentration.
