**HOW DO CONCENTRATIONS WORK?**

Students who wish to specialize in a particular segment of the hospitality industry have a choice of a variety of concentration options to focus their studies in that field. Concentration courses replace the Hospitality College electives in the Hospitality Management Major and must be completed with a grade of C or better.

Declaring a concentration may take place any time after the student has been admitted to the Harrah College of Hospitality. It is necessary to schedule an appointment with an academic advisor to declare a concentration.

\*A concentration is not required. Students also have the option to take a generalist approach by completing 15 credits of Hospitality Electives with courses of their own selection. Students can choose from a variety of topics that meet their interests or guide them in a specific direction, that may lead them into the Hospitality career of their dreams.
