Lee Business School BSBA Degree, International Business 2019-2020

The international business major provides students with a general understanding and appreciation of global business and economic environments, various cultures, and diverse values. Since an increasing share of local, regional and national economic activities is attributed to exports, imports, trade in intellectual property and technology-intensive products, U.S. foreign investment abroad, and foreign investment in the U.S., personnel is required both at home and abroad, with solid academic base for dealing with the volatile concepts, practices and integrated international business organizations. Personnel must have an in-depth understanding of other nations, languages and cultures. There are many opportunities for students to obtain part of their international business courses at world universities, such as through UNLV's Turin, Italy program.

Functional Business Area Requirement -- Total Credits: 9

Three 3-credit, upper-division (300- and 400- level) courses from one of the following functional areas of business (ECON, FIN, MGT, and MKT). Courses taken to satisfy the international business requirement may not be counted toward the functional business area requirement.

- ECON: ECON 312 or ECON 358 and two upper-division (300- and 400- level) IB or ECON electives.
- FIN: FIN 308 and two upper-division (300- and 400- level) IB or FIN electives.
- MGT: Three upper-division (300- and 400- level) IB or MGT electives.
- MKT: Three upper-division (300- and 400- level) IB or MKT electives.

<u>Language/Area Studies Requirement - Total Credits: 6</u>

Students must demonstrate an understanding of world culture through world language or area-studies courses. This requirement is satisfied by the completion of six credits in:

- A. 300-level or higher courses taught in another language and/or
- B. Approved courses in area studies. For the list of approved courses, see an academic advisor in Lee Business School Undergraduate Advising.

Minimum of a C in all courses is required.

The number of general electives needed to earn the minimum 120 credits required for graduation varies, depending on the total credits used to satisfy academic requirements. A student should count the number of credits needed to meet degree requirements and subtract that from the minimum credits required to earn the degree (120). The difference is the number of general elective credits needed. In the sample academic plan above, some of the foreign-language courses satisfy general electives.

- Minimum C (2.0) grade required in the prerequisite in order to continue with subsequent courses. Minimum C grade required to satisfy degree requirements.
- Admission to the major required to enroll in upper-division business courses.
- Lee Business School's Course-Repeat Policy: Students may take business courses a maximum of three times for degree applicability.
- Students should apply for graduation at least two semesters prior to their expected graduation date. Please see MyUNLV to initiate graduation and speak with your advisor about eligibility.
