Course Description

Skill and knowledge development in the application of emergency care procedures. Topics covered include basic CPR & AED certification, primary and secondary evaluation, wound care, splinting, recognition and management of sudden illnesses/injuries and other life-threatening conditions.

Course Objectives

- 1. Students will obtain understanding of basic anatomy and medical terminology as it relates to injury/illness.
- 2. Students will obtain the skills to perform basic CPR with AED and will have the option of obtaining certification from the American Heart Association.
- 3. Students will learn the skills necessary for an entry-level healthcare provider to plan for and implement evaluation and treatment of acute emergencies as a result of physical activity.

- 2. Students are responsible for **completing the required readings** prior to viewing material related to the corresponding class modules.
 - a. This is for your benefit and is a strong practice for academic success. Students who actually read the textbook and use its resources tend to understand the material better, they are able to ask relevant, clarifying questions during lecture or lab times, and they allow themselves multiple opportunities to revisit the information throughout the week. This correlates with better academic performance and success in the class. *So please do it!*
- 3. Students will not eat in the lab. Drinks are permissible if in a closed container.
- 4. **No photography is allowed in the lab**. Any unauthorized cell phone use in lab will be subject to a 1% grade deduction.
