Stealing Las Vegas: The 10th Anniversary of UNLV Film's First Feature

Once upon a time, a little more than ten years ago, UNLV Film embarked on a project for the ages: their first feature-length film. *Stealing Las Vegas* featured bona fide Hollywood acting talent. The project featured professional actors like **Eric Roberts**, **Nate Bynum**, **Antonio Fargas**, **Michael Tylo** and **Eloy Méndez** alongside young actors and cast members from UNLV Film and the Department of Theatre. Directed and co-written by UNLV Film Professor **Francisco Menendez** and packaged as a legitimate Hollywood-Vegas caper flick, *Stealing Las Vegas* broke new ground for UNLV Film. Many members of the student production team, the cast and *Stealing Las Vegas* crew members are still tightly-knit and in touch with one another today.

The 10th Anniversary screening of *Stealing Las Vegas* proved infinitely worthy of the September, 22nd, 2023 reunion celebration and panel discussion at UNLV. Dozens of original cast and production team members gathered for a gala reception, screening, and post-screening interviews featuring the producers and members of the company. The event took place in UNLV Film's new Dolby-Atmos Theatre. A private, pre-event VIP gathering featured the film's trailer, the "making-of" video, and a champagne toast with select actors and the producers. Labyrinth Dance! Rebels at Lunch Performance Series on 10/4

The new UNLV Labyrinth is a donor-inspired project, and the result of an anonymous donation to the UNLV Division of Student Life. Designed by UNLV School of Architecture landscape architecture students, the labyrinth design was produced by three competing teams during a special weekend project charrette in September of 2021. Working with alumni professionals from the J.W. Zunino Landscape Architecture firm, working drawings were produced along with a construction budget for the project. Grounbreaking on the physical site (adjacent to the upper division dorms) took place in May of 2022, and the labyrinth itself was completed by the end of last summer. How would the new site adapt for events? Enter the UNLV Fine Arts Alumni Chapter.


The College of Fine Arts Alumni Chapter created a series of Rebels at Lunch Concerts in 2017, as a way to give current students an opportunity to perform for alumni, faculty and staff audiences during their lunch hour. Working with the UNLV School of Music and other Fine Arts faculty members, a half-dozen of these concerts have been presented in the ensuing years, with lunch provided by the Chapter for both the performers and guests. Unfortunately, the series (like everything else) was interrupted by two-years of pandemic closures. When live events resumed, the Chapter made the decision to expand the series to include dance.

Professor of Dance **Cathy Allen** answered the call and on Wednesday, October 4th a casual but enthusiastic audience gathered on the residence halls lawn for a trio of dance selections, sub sandwiches, and cold drinks. The pieces, performed by both current students and alumni, included Allen's own *Beauty For Ashes*, **Victoria Dale's** *Unmasked*, and excerpts from Stravinsky's *The Firebird*.



UNLV's First Dual Winter Commencement: A Celebration of Achievement

How big is too big? While the Thomas & Mack Center is humongous, today UNLV is producing significantly more graduates completing their degrees in December. Since 1998, UNLV has offered a single December Commencement ceremony. They may represent different facets of architecture, but are both highly respected in the Vegas Valley. Best yet, both are passionate about giving back to UNLV, not only by teaching and mentoring students, but also in hiring numerous UNLV School of Architecture alumni.

Dwayne Eshenbaugh AIA, NCARB, LEED AP, is the founder of NOVUS Architecture, an award-winning firm located in the Las Vegas Arts District. NOVUS provides architecture, interior design, planning, and sustainability services to like-minded clients. After earning his undergraduate degree from the UNLV School of Architecture, Dwayne received his masters at the University of Arizona, where he was honored as outstanding graduate student. At NOVUS, Dwayne has synthesized his 25 years of leadership and experience. A military veteran (U.S. Air Force), Dwayne served as AIA Las Vegas President in 2019 and AIA Nevada President in 2020.

Landscape Architect **Cecilia Schafler** PLA, Sites AP, is the Founder and President of Henderson's Lage Design, one of Nevada's top landscape architecture firms. Recognized for her many contributions to the field, Cecilia was honored with a pair of NVASLA President's Awards (in 2017 and 2018), and as the 2021 recipient of the NVASLA's Silver Award, their highest honor. She is the first UNLV alumna and the first woman to receive that prestigious award.



Spring '23 at the Barrick! Triple Exhibitions Opening in March

he Barrick Museum of Art is proud to announce the debut of three intriguing shows for Spring 2023, to be launched formally at the BMoA's free opening reception on Friday, March 24th (from 5 pm - 8 pm). These concurrent exhibitions are as follows:

Exhibition 1: **Am I Your Type**, is an exhibition centered around the communicative possibilities of text and typefaces. Here, artists, designers, and Las Vegas history come together to illuminate the intersection between written language and the visual arts. They share space with archival materials such as casino promotions, vintage menus, and photographic documentation of vernacular lettering at public meetings and demonstrations. *Am I Your Type* includes work by several alumni and faculty artists, including **China Adams**, **Justin Favela**, **Ashley Hairston Doughty**, **Dan Hernandez**, **Danielle Kelly**, **Sean Slattery**, and more. *Am I Your Type* can be experienced from **March 14 - July 8**, **2023**

Exhibition 2: **Modern Desert Markings**, *An Homage to Las Vegas Area Land Art*. Land Art plays a unique role in Nevada's artistic heritage. For this exhibition, curators Katie Hoffman and Hikmet Sidney Loe have selected ten artists to produce new work inspired by historic Southern Nevadan Land Art creations by Walter De Maria, Michael Heizer, and Jean Tinguely. Working in drawing, sculpture, photography, and more, the artists bring fresh and critical eyes to these celebrated works from the 1960s and '70s. *Modern Desert Markings* and *Crowd Burst* can be experienced from **March 14 - July 8, 2023**

In Bloom: The Spring 2023 UNLV Dance Experience



A highlight of the concert is the classic 1963 work *Cantilever* by Erick Hawkins, a significant 20th century choreographer of modern dance. *Cantilever* will be presented at UNLV and will then be presented as part of the **Martha Graham Dance Company season** at New York's prestigious Joyce Theater in April 2023.

Spring Forward on April 13-15, 2023, is the concert of milestone and capstone choreographed works with lighting designed by Bachelor of Fine Arts majors.

The season will conclude with the virtual treat, *Last Dance* on Friday, May 5, 2023, a final streaming concert of exciting works.

The 2023 UNLV Dance season includes choreography by full time dance faculty Cathy Allen, Victoria Dale, Louis Kavouras, Dolly Kelepecz-Momot, and new faculty member Jason Hortin, with lighting design by faculty design specialist Michael Jarett.





Jenna Wurtzberger, 2009 Dance, choreographed, filmed, and edited Perpetual Quietus, a transformational 2022 screen-dance film shot at the Boulder City Dry Lake Bed. After earning dual degrees at UNLV, Jenna added an MFA in Dance from Temple University in Philadelphia. She has worked with, or taught for the Pennsylvania Ballet, Kansas City Ballet, Temple University, Missouri Valley College, Cottey College, and at UNLV. Jenna established both the Biomart Movement Society and NACHMO, which issues an annual January Challenge to inspire dancers, choreographers, and movement enthusiasts to choreograph by providing a month-long deadline to complete their work and connect it to a community of peers.

Daniel Chenin, AIA, NCARB, LEED AP BD+C, 2002, 2005 Architecture, has been recognized by the American Institute of Architects with the 2022 Silver Medal for the State of Nevada. This is the highest honor that the AIA Nevada can bestow upon a member architect. The founder of Daniel Joseph Chenin, Ltd., his firm provides full service turn-key architecture and interior design services for residential and commercial clients throughout the State of Nevada and beyond.

Valentine Baron, 2022 Music, was named the 2023 winner of the National Opera Association Dissertation Competition for her document Developing Vocal Agility of Light Coloratura Soprano Voices through the Neglected Repertoire of the French Opera Comique. A native of France, Dr. Baron has sung with the New York Lyric Theater and Regina Opera.

Trexy Dunnam, 2022 Architecture, recently received the AIA Nevada Honor Award for her academic project Family Friendly Housing. Trexy is an architectural design professional with the Las Vegas firm NOVUS Architecture, and a proud native of The Philippines.

Andy Carney, 2008 Film, won the 2023 Emmy Award for his editing work on the Netflix reality series *Making Fun*. After UNLV, Andy earned his MFA at Chapman University and is Lead Editor at FoxHound Productions in Topanga, California.

Dennis Schebetta, 1998 Theatre, is an assistant professor of acting and directing at Skidmore College and co-author (with John Basil) of Building a Performance: An Actor's Guide to Rehearsal, published by Rowman and Littlefield. He holds an MFA in theatre pedagogy from Virginia Commonwealth University and trained in the two-year Meisner program. 
