Community Engagement at UNLV



Carnegie Classification for Community Engagement -In 2020, UNLV became a first-time recipient of the Carnegie Classification for Community Engagement after a multi-year examination of the university's identity and culture, assessment, policies, and service learning. UNLV is currently preparing its application for recertification.

- Guided by the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching
- Community engagement describes the collaboration between institutions of higher education and their larger communities (local, regional/state, national, global) for the mutually beneficial exchange of knowledge and resources in a context of partnership and reciprocity.
- Purpose of community engagement partnership of university knowledge and resources with those of the public and private sectors to enrich scholarship, research, and creative activity; enhance curriculum, teaching and learning; prepare educated, engaged citizens; strengthen democratic values and civic responsibility; address critical societal issues; and contribute to the public good.
