Other General Degree Requirements

- Minimum 120 credits required to graduate
- 42 credits must be Upper Division (courses numbered 300 or higher)
- Minimum 30 Upper Division credits must be completed at UNLV
- 50% of Department requirements must be completed at UNLV
- Last 30 credits must be earned as a declared major in the College of Liberal Arts
- 2.0 Cumulative UNLV GPA required to graduate
- Maximum 4 credits of PEX can be used towards graduate requirements
- At least one Multicultural and one International course must be completed. Students can combine these courses with others in their major or the General Education.

- Choose 2 courses in Literature or Cultural Studies at the 400-level

Complete 12 credits as follows:

- ENG 407A Fundamentals of Business Writing or ENG 407B – Fundamentals of Technical Writing
- ENG 400 Document Design
- ENG 406B Electronic Documents and Publications
- ENG 407C Advanced Professional Communication

Cultural Studies Concentration

Complete 15 credits as follows:

- ENG 330 Introduction to Cultural Studies
- Cultural Rhetorics & Literacies (3 credits)
- Media & Film Studies (3 credits)
- Gender & Sexuality Studies (3 credits)
- Multicultural (3 credits)
