

## Psychology Research Activity – Student Handout

### Purpose:

In Psychology classes, students are exposed to the results of scientific studies. For students to better understand this research, the UNLV Department of Psychology requires that all PSY 101 students have a direct experience with psychological research.

### Website, Registering, and Asking Questions:

- Visit the [Subject Pool website](#) – you must register on the Sona site to earn credits!
- To register, click “SONA” and request a new account for a login and password. Once registered, you can sign up for studies and/or submit article summaries.
- Questions or problems? Email the Subject Pool ([subjectpool@gmail.com](mailto:subjectpool@gmail.com)).

### Requirements:

- PSY 101 students must earn a total of **6 CREDITS** by the final deadline.
- You can participate in (online or in-person) studies posted on Sona, complete article summaries, or have a combination of credits from both.
- At least 3 credits must be completed by the midsemester deadline.
- A maximum of 3 credits can be earned from online studies.
- Due to ethical concerns, if you are under 18 years of age, you may not find many studies for which you qualify (you may have to primarily complete article summaries).

### Studies (Online or In-person):

- All psychology studies are approved by the UNLV IRB (ethics committee) and are advertised on the Sona website.
- They range from 0.5 to 9.0 credits – the number of credits roughly corresponds to the expected time commitment for that study.
- Studies can be either online or in-person (typically in a campus lab or classroom).
- Any information collected in studies are kept confidential.
- Please give at least 12 hours of notice to cancel an appointment (do this in Sona or by contacting the experimenter for that study).
- Appointments are easier to obtain earlier in the semester (than near the deadlines).

### Article Summaries:

- You can only use articles on the Article Summary form posted on the website.
- Use the UNLV library to locate and download an article. Read the article and then complete the article summary form from the website.
- Use **YOUR OWN WORDS** (plagiarism will be reported for disciplinary action).
- Each article summary (scored as satisfactory) is worth 1 research credit. Unsatisfactory summaries submitted at the final deadline cannot be resubmitted after the final deadline.

### Deadlines:

Midsemester and final deadlines are posted on the website. Because there are a large number of students taking PSY 101 each semester, there are **NO EXCEPTIONS** to the final deadlines.
