Notes:

1. For the language/area studies requirement, students must demonstrate an understanding of world culture through world-language or area-studies courses. This requirement is satisfied by the completion of six credits in:
 - a. 300-level or higher courses taught in another language, and/or
 - b. Approved courses in area studies. For the list of approved area-studies courses, see an academic advisor in Lee Business School Undergraduate Advising.
2. A student without any prior knowledge in a foreign language may need four semesters of a language to be able to take the 300-level language classes. In this case, it will be necessary to take one language class in each of the first four semesters.
