### What are your next steps?

1. Create a list of scholarships for which you are eligible.
  - a. Take note of GPA requirements, citizenship requirements, destination/major of study requirements, language requirements, length of stay requirements, etc.
2. Notate each scholarship deadline, including the submission time and time zone.
3. Notate any supplemental requirements you might need.
  - a. Examples: Number of essays, letters of recommendation, transcripts, etc.
4. Use UNLV's Writing Center and International Programs for help in brainstorming and crafting competitive essays.
5. For non-UNLV-based scholarships, you can make an appointment with your study abroad advisor for an essay review.
6. Continue to look for new funding opportunities.

### Make it Happen with Financial Planning

- Consider all other funding revenue available to you outside of scholarships

- Consider finding a program at or below UNLV's cost of attendance
- Shorter programs can also be an option for cost savings
- Some programs have a flat rate for tuition between 12-18 credits
- Set up a financial strategy early on to save money
  - Every month take something out of your income and put it in your study abroad savings
- Have a financial back up plan. If things don't pan out for certain scholarships, how can you still make this happen?
  - Switch to a different program, push plans back for a semester/year, or take out a student loan?
