THE BROOKINGS PUBLIC POLICY MINOR

The Brookings Public Policy Minor at UNLV is a unique educational experience that offers a multidisciplinary curriculum based upon local, national, and global themes in public policy. Courses in the Brookings Public Policy Minor unite the best teaching and scholarship from UNLV faculty with national experts and scholars from the Brookings Institution in Washington, D.C. Through Brookings Mountain West, this collaboration draws upon the diverse faculty and programmatic interests of UNLV to link knowledge, academic inquiry, and practice with the outstanding policy programs of the Brookings Institution.

In Brookings Public Policy Minor courses, students will:

- Learn about real people in real places
- Link societies by their connections and commonalities as much as by their differences
- Integrate general issues of globalization, past and present, into the study of specific people and places in the world
- Include cross-disciplinary approaches to break down conventional academic barriers
- Emphasize experiential as well as classroom learning
- Foster research and information literacy through coordinated lectures, readings, and assignments

The Brookings Public Policy Minor is an 18-credit program which requires completion of URST 101: Brookings: Introduction to Public Policy, and a pre-approved independent study course supervised by a UNLV faculty member. Additionally, students are required to complete 4 upper division courses from a pre-approved list (see below) to fulfill the minor. Students must have a UNLV GPA of 3.00 in order to declare the Brookings Public Policy Minor. Students must maintain a minimum Brookings Public Policy Minor GPA of 3.00 across all classes used to fulfill the requirements of the minor.

^{**}Students complete the Brookings Public Policy Minor with a Culminating Project, fulfilled through enrollment and completion of an independent study course, which results in a detailed policy brief. Students will work under the supervision of a UNLV faculty member to complete their paper based on the format of a Brookings policy brief. Select policy briefs produced from the Brookings Public Policy Minor Culminating Project may be published by Brookings Mountain West.

HOW TO BECOME A BROOKINGS PUBLIC POLICY MINOR STUDENT

- Declare the minor; schedule an appointment with the Greenspun College of Urban Affairs Advising Center, or send an email to urbanaffairs@unlv.edu

HOW TO COMPLETE THE BROOKINGS PUBLIC POLICY MINOR (BPPM)

- Schedule a meeting with Greenspun College of Urban Affairs Advising Center to confirm you have maintained the requisite GPA and to verify that you have completed all essential coursework (with the exception of the independent study course) to complete the Brookings Public Policy Minor.
- Schedule a meeting with Brookings Mountain West staff to discuss your plan and gain approval for the
 policy brief you will author to fulfill the requirement of the Brookings Public Policy Minor Culminating
 Project.
- Develop a Culminating Project 1-page proposal and timeline for completion with the guidance of Brookings Mountain West staff.
- Identify a UNLV faculty member who agrees to supervise your BPPM Culminating Project, and agree upon the project and timeline as defined in your Culminating Project 1-page proposal.
- Enroll in a pre-approved 3 credit independent study course, instructed by the UNLV faculty member supervising your BPPM Culminating Project.
- Complete your policy brief and receive final approval from the UNLV faculty member supervising your BPPM Culminating Project by the end of the enrolled semester.
- Once the final draft is received and graded by your UNLV faculty member, email Brookings Mountain West staff your Culminating Project.
- Follow up on any subsequent email requests from Brookings Mountain West staff.
