Director's Note: Transfer group advising is by major.

Program Specific Information: All fine arts require 42 upper-level credits. Art Courses Required by UNLV: 2.7 minimum GPA in 101,107, 108,156, 260, 261, 262 or 263.

Students wanting to major in Graphic Design & Media should apply as Pre-Graphic Design. Admission to upper division coursework requires a 3.0 GPA and portfolio review after all lower division requirements are completed.

- Admission to upper division course work requires an application process. Students will be scored on the following:
 - Their successful completion of the Basic Design courses and their science w/ lab requirement.
 - Cumulative GPA.
 - A portfolio of their design work. This portfolio also contains their statement of intent.

Program Application Requirements

Each spring, a panel of Graphic Design faculty will review the work of qualifying students for acceptance into the Graphic Design & Media program. Students who are selected to the program may continue taking the remaining Graphic Design & Media core courses. Students who are not recommended for the program may either change majors or reapply the following year. Students may apply for the program up to two times. In order to qualify for the Graphic Design Program Portfolio Review, students must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.7 in all Art- and Design-related coursework.

Portfolio and Application

After confirming that the course requirements have been met, students may apply for the Graphic Design & Media program by submitting a portfolio that includes the following: A portfolio of projects completed within Graphic Design & Media core courses. Supportive work from other art or design-related courses or projects created outside of the university. Specifications for the portfolio application and the deadline of application will first be announced during the Fall semester each year. Formal calls for applications are announced early in the Spring semester. Applications are due in the middle of the Spring semester.

Transfer Policies:

REVISED 50/50 RULE

 The policy stating that UNLV will only accept up to 60 credits to be transferred and applied to any specific program/major is no longer in place. Unless a college/major has a specific requirement on credit limitations i.e., Lee Business School, College of Education, transfer credits from 2-year institutions should no longer be limited to 60 credits. At least 30 credits of upper division from UNLV are now required to obtain a Bachelor's.

REPEAT POLICY

- Students may retake a CSN course as often as needed to gain a better grade and, thereby, a
 higher grade point average. Only the highest grade received will count as part of the total CSN
 grade point average. All repeated courses taken at CSN will remain as part of a student's
 permanent academic record.
 - *PLEASE NOTE: While CSN accepts the BEST grade, UNLV accepts the LAST grade.
- To improve GPA and change the original grade the course must be repeated at the institution that it was completed. For example, if a student takes MATH 124 at CSN and receives an F the course must be repeated at CSN to replace the grade and improve the GPA.

REVERSE TRANSFER

Students who have earned 15 or more credits at CSN and have transferred to a four-year
institution without an associate's degree may "reverse transfer" the earned credits from the
four-year institution to complete an associate's degree. This process makes it possible for
students to earn an associate's degree as they continue to work toward completing their
bachelor's degree.

NOTE: Some courses that fulfill specific general education requirements at CSN may fulfill different general education requirements at UNLV. Please see a UNLV/CSN Transfer Program Advisor to confirm your choices.
