Course Description: Provides background and skill development on the organization, implementation, and evaluation of community-based nutrition programs for individuals and communities.

Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Describe the roles and responsibilities of community nutrition professionals and arenas of practice.
- Understand the health care system and national health objectives as they relate to community nutrition.
- Describe the role of public policy including current nutrition guidelines and the legislative process as it relates to community nutrition.
- Understand and describe the components of nutrition programming, i.e., assessment,

- development of objectives, implementation, evaluation and marketing.
- Identify local and national nutrition education/assistance programs, the target audiences they serve and their key objectives.
- Work within a team to apply information on program planning, implementation and evaluation to the development of a mock nutrition/health intervention program.

Course Policies (Important Notes)

- Attendance is required for this course. Per DPND guidelines, a 10% deduction will be made on your overall grade if you have missed more than one (1) class session.
- We will be engaging in activities and discussions that require active participation during class.
 Participation is expected. Please make sure to read the chapter and complete all assignments as noted on the Course Schedule. Also take the time to prepare for class activities that will be posted in each week's module.
- Deadlines for almost all assignments will be on Fridays at 11:59 pm. There are two instances when the due date moves to Sunday at 11:59 pm. These are noted on the Course Schedule. There is one assignment that will be completed in class and due at the end of class.
- All assignments, except for RD Exam Practice Quizzes & the Program Evaluation Assignment, will be
 available from the first day of the semester. It is recommended that students work ahead. Late work will
 only be accepted for legitimate emergencies if documentation is provided. Leaving assignments until
 the last minute, work schedules, and forgetting are not legitimate emergencies.
- All written assignments must be typed. Assignment dates are firm. See the Late Work Policy for further information on late submissions.
- Sometimes the subject matter of classes overlaps, and an assignment can meet the requirements for more than one class. If this is the case, standards of academic honesty require that you inform your instructors of your intentions and get written approval before pursuing the assignments.
- The use of AI in writing assignments is not permitted in this course unless instructions specifically state that it is allowed.
- Some of the assignments in this course will utilize TurnItIn to check for plagiarism. TurnItIn also checks for probably Al generated content. General matches above 15% will be examined, and significant

matches will automatically be reported to the Office of Student Conduct. Academic sanctions will be determined based on the severity of the infraction. Probable AI matches above 10% will be examined thoroughly and could result in a report to the Office of Student Conduct. Academic sanctions will be determined based on the severity of the infraction.

- Once points are issued via Web Campus for any quiz, assignment, or project, students have 72 hours
 to ask questions about earned points. After that, points will not be changed. There is also no guarantee
 that points will be changed due to an inquiry. The instructor reserves all rights in the final grading
 decisions.

Course Assignments

The following is a list of all graded assignments for this course. Please see Web Campus / Canvas for further assignment descriptions.

Class Participation (12 weeks x 15 points) Participation in class activities is required. Ten points will be taken off for not participating in class activities (case studies, group activities, etc.) *Tardiness to class of more than 15 minutes will result in an automatic 5 point deduction in the day's participation points.*

Healthcare Systems Discussion Posting (60 points): Students will respond to a discussion post via the Web Campus / Canvas discussion tab. All responses must be professional and courteous, or you will be deducted points. The use of Al generated content is not permitted for this assignment.

Information Portfolio (40 points): Students will collect information from the course and put it together in a portfolio to be used in the future.

RD Exam Practice Quizzes (4x20 points): There will be four RD Exam Practice quizzes worth 20 points each over the course of the semester. These quizzes are designed to simulate the style of questions you will receive on the RD exam and will be delivered in the same way that you will receive them on the RD exam. Questions will be delivered one at a time. Clicking out of the quiz window for any reason will result in a zero on the quiz. Activity logs will be checked. For this reason, it is suggested that students disable pop-ups prior to taking the quiz.

Nutrition Kitchen Project (100 points): You will be to create either a short video, article, nutrition education module, handout, game, quiz or combination of all these items that can be posted onto a community nutrition program's website. You will need to address literacy level, socioeconomic status, and include a recipe. All generated content is not permitted for this project.

Community Intervention Project + Peer Review (295 points): Students will be assigned to teams of 3-4 individuals for the project that will run throughout the semester. Topics will be assigned using Position Statements and Papers from the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics as the starting point. The project will involve reading, research, compilation of data from local sources, and creativity. The result will be a written report (100 points) and a video presentation (100 points). There will also be a media pitch (20 points) component to this project. Each team will submit a single written report for which all team members will receive the same grade.

Points for the written portion will be assigned throughout the semester as segments of the CIP are due every couple of weeks beginning with the Literature Review towards the end of September. Each segment that is turned in will be graded as if it is the final version.

Al generated content is not permitted for this project.

Students will be graded individually for the video presentation (even though you will be recording this video together as a team). You can record a video on your phone, with a screen capturing tool or a web conferencing tool such as Google Meet/Hangouts, WebEx, Skype, or Zoom. You can use any video tool you'd like but need to submit as an assignment in Panopto (UNLV's media content management system) in Web Campus. You can also use Panopto to record your video!

There is also a self and peer review component which will be worth 100 points out of the total 375 points.

Program Evaluation Assignment (50 Points): Each group will be assigned a program to evaluate. The evaluating group will be given the written report and presentation of another group. An evaluation form will be provided. It is expected that each evaluating group will give thorough and thoughtful feedback. This assignment will be done in class as a group project. This assignment will be due at the end of class that day. Failure to attend class that day will result in a zero on the assignment.

Cengage MindTap Homework (195 points): Students will complete two homework assignments in the MindTap platform for each chapter covered during the semester (15 chapters.)
