A. Discussion and Approval of Funding for Executive Bill 55-13: An Act To Appropriate Funds For The UNLV Cultural Celebrations Banner

Chair Curry requests time for the Discussion and Approval of Executive Bill 55-13. All costs must be encumbered from the CSUN Interest Bearing Account Budget Line. Executive Bill 55-13 may be found in the CSUN Legislation Record and accompanying Supplemental Materials attached to this agenda. The request may be subject to amendments at the discretion of the Senate.

Vice President Tolano- Presents 55-13 as found in the supplemental. Talks about the creation of the banners and collaborating with departments.

Senator Navarro Mendoza- Asks what colors for the Latinx Banner stood for.

Vice President Tolano- States there was a suggestion to use the colors, there was no specific reasoning.

Senator Navarro Mendoza- Asks about being able to choose between the different concepts.

Advisor Dow- States banners worked with IGS and SCE. States concept/draft 3 are the

banners that would be approved. States they can work with IGS before it goes into production.

Senator Ibarra Lira- Talks about having GPSA contributing to the banners. States the Latinx banner looks close to the LGBTQ banner. States they want to see the final version. Mentions tabling the item.

Advisor Dow- States they are pulling the graphic designer's final version. States the color scheme they may be using concept 2. States GPSA doesn't have the funds to contribute, states President Odunze wants to represent all rebels.

Senator Navarro Mendoza- States if bill is passed today if they can still give input on the banner drafts.

Vice President Tolano- States they should be able to receive input since the banners have not been ordered.

Senator Cameron- Asks if the colors are friendly for those with color blindness/color deficiency.

Advisor Dow- States there is not really a way to fully bypass it. States message is universal with text.

Senator King- Asks Senate President Flores to scroll through the banners.

Senator Von Seggern- Asks about potential vandalism.

Vice President Tolano- States there is not a plan for vandalism.

Advisor Dow- States they can reprint with IGS. States the bulk of the cost is installing.

Senator Hankins- Asks about under Addendum A, stating they will be evaluated for future use.

Advisor Dow- States they will be up for a year and will be evaluated for continued use or updates.

Senator Coss- Asks if the final draft of the banners must be voted on for the passage of the bill.

Advisor Dow- The most important part is the cost. States final adjustment to the banners can be done.

Advisor Dow- Gives presentation on the CSUN Office Furniture Project. Presentation can be found in the supplemental materials. Talks about the CSUN IBA account and potential costs for various upgrades to the CSUN office. Provides 4 budget options.

SPPT Ibarra Lira- is excused for the rest of the meeting at 6:52 pm.

Senator Coss- Shows concern for desks for the Director's chambers. States they think that the Director's chamber desks don't need to be done since it is more of an internal space.

Advisor Dow- States because it is an internal space, they chose Office Depot desks. Talks about professionalism reflecting the space.

Senate President Flores- States Directors to bring leadership and outside members in the chambers. Shows in favor of funding the Director chambers desks.

Associate Director Munoz- Agrees with Senate President Flores. States they meet with RSOs and groups.

Senator Von Seggern- States the project doesn't benefit the constituents in which the money comes from.

Senator Brooks- Agrees with Senator Von Seggern. States it is a lot of money to spend on the space.

Senator Beals- Asks if the project would affect the student body or if there were comments from students about the space.

Advisor Dow- Talks about the need for upgrades within the office. States fees also come from CSUN members.

Senate President Flores- States the project is for the future of inspiring future student leaders.

Senator Yelvington- States they found the same desk on Amazon for a better price. Asks about the process of selecting the new desks.

Advisor Dow- States the University has specific approved vendors for furniture.

President Odunze- States the project is an investment. Suggests funding the long-term.

Senate President Flores- Asks about the amount in the IBA.

Advisor Dow- \$630,000.

Senate President Flores- Asks about the IBA limit.

Advisor Dow- States the Board of Regents questions when there is too much money saved in the IBA.

Senate President Flores- States there hasn't been much IBA usage.

Advisor Dow- States they will never advise spending money without strategy.

Senate President Flores- States one criteria for a project from the IBA is that the project can be matched if additional funding comes from an outside organization.

Senator Yelvington- Asks how the desks were chosen.

Advisor Dow- States they looked up options.

Vice President Tolano- States they were presented with options and thought it was the most fitting.

Senator Mohen- Asks what would happen to the old furniture.

Advisor Dow- States there is a University Policy.

Senator Mohen- Asks if departments we are partnered with are only going to be offered the furniture.

Advisor Dow- States they can give the furniture to any department.

Senator Brooks- Talks about a full remodel for the Director's chambers. Asks about furniture from Amazon.

Advisor Dow- States they could not find it from Office Depot, only for smaller items bought.

Senator Brooks- States that it can be fiscally irresponsible to hold too much funds in the IBA and not put forth funds for IBA projects that are worthwhile.

Advisor Dow- States they want CSUN to spend money on projects that are worthwhile.

President Odunze- States the bill is not meant to just spend money, states it is an investment to improve the space.

Senator Navarro Mendoza- Shows favor towards the bill. Asks about chairs for the project.

Advisor Dow- States the chair count is only for the Senate chambers and Conference room.

Senator Navarro Mendoza- Asks about the timeline of the project.

Advisor Dow- States they would start to buy some furniture this week. States they would start the order with the furniture. Wants to get the project done this fiscal year.

Director Eyob- States the space is shared and having a professional space would represent CSUN.

Senator Morfinez Solis takes a point of personal privilege at 7:40 pm.

Advisor Dow- States not all projects affect the entire student body.

Director Eyob- Agrees with Advisor Dow.

Senator Ferraris- Asks about clarification of the furniture and the last time furniture was replaced.
