AN ACT TO APPROPRIATE ONE-TIME FUNDS FOR THE STUDENT AMBASSADORS FOR COLLEGE RECRUITMENT SPONSORSHIP FOR THE HONORS COLLEGE

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada Las Vegas (CSUN) represents all 27,000+ undergraduate students enrolled at the University of Nevada Las Vegas; and

WHEREAS, the Senate of the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada Las Vegas, under the authority of CSUN Constitution VI.D.01, is “empowered to enact any legislation that falls under the jurisdiction of CSUN”; **AND**

WHEREAS, CSUN must actively advocate and represent the needs of all undergraduate students; **AND**

WHEREAS, CSUN makes it its mission to “to provide resources to enhance the student experience, help build community on campus, and empower leadership skills”; **AND**

WHEREAS, CSUN sponsorships play a vital role in supporting essential UNLV entities and their operations that positively impact the undergraduate student body; **AND**

WHEREAS, the Student Ambassadors for College Recruitment Sponsorship, which provides a permanent funding mechanism that financially compensates students that serve in student ambassador roles - in order to promote the recruitment of new undergraduate students in their respective college programs; **AND**

WHEREAS, the University Initiatives committee (under the Legislative Branch of CSUN) serves with the purposes of improving the UNLV campus and community, addressing and advocating for undergraduate student interests, needs, and concerns related to (but not limited to) health, safety, diversity, social justice, and sustainability; **AND**

WHEREAS, the Student Ambassador role empowers students by giving them first hand experience in public speaking through tours, presentations, and recruitment events, interpersonal communication with prospective students and families, recruitment operations and event coordination, networking with faculty, staff, and industry professionals, and leadership within a highly visible student-facing role; **AND**

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED, CSUN shall appropriate \$2,000.00 one-time (1) sponsorship for the Student Ambassadors for College Recruitment Sponsorship for the Honors College for the 2026-2027 academic year. This allocation will reflect the CSUN Scholarship program for the 2026-2027 academic year only. After the 2026-2027 academic year, the Student Ambassadors for College Recruitment Sponsorship for the Honors College will no longer receive this one-time sponsorship funding from CSUN.

LET IT FURTHER BE RESOLVED, The CSUN University Initiatives Committee may choose to provide again funds for the Student Ambassadors for College Recruitment Sponsorship for the Office of the Honors College from the One-time Sponsorship Funds in future years if the committee chooses to do so.
