SENATE BILL 56-73

AN ACT TO AMEND THE CSUN BYLAW CHAPTER 1204 UNDOCUNETWORK SPONSORSHIP

WHEREAS, the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada Las Vegas (CSUN) represents all 27,000+ undergraduate students enrolled at the University of Nevada Las Vegas; and

WHEREAS, the Senate of the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada Las Vegas, under the authority of CSUN Constitution VI.D.01, is “empowered to enact any legislation that falls under the jurisdiction of CSUN”; **AND**

WHEREAS, the University Initiatives committee (under the Legislative Branch of CSUN) serves with the purposes of improving the UNLV campus and community, addressing and advocating for undergraduate student interests, needs, and concerns related to (but not limited to) health, safety, diversity, social justice, and sustainability; **AND**

WHEREAS, the Senate of the Consolidated Students of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas is empowered to enact legislation within the jurisdiction of CSUN; **AND**

WHEREAS, CSUN Sponsorships are managed through the CSUN University Initiatives Committee as maintained within Title XII of the CSUN Bylaws; **AND**

WHEREAS, the University Initiatives Committee is responsible for managing ongoing CSUN Sponsorships and recommending measures that better control and manage the CSUN Sponsorships budget; **AND**

WHEREAS, the CSUN Attorney General identified that Chapter 1204: UNDOCUNETWORK is missing language requiring unexpended sponsorship funds to be returned to the CSUN Sponsorship budget; **AND**

WHEREAS, adding return-of-funds language promotes fiscal accountability, consistency across CSUN Sponsorship chapters, and clearer expectations for sponsored UNLV entities;

THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED, that CSUN Bylaws Chapter 1204: UNDocuNetwork Sponsorship, Section 03: Requirements is hereby amended as outlined in Addendum A.

ADDENDUM A

CHAPTER 1204: UNDOCUNETWORK SPONSORSHIP SECTION 03: REQUIREMENTS

- A. All money disbursed towards the DREAMzone program (\$10,000) must be used for the purpose of paying UndocuNetwork members for DREAMzone training and presentations they provide (\$10,000).
 - 1. Each fiscal year, a representative from UndocuNetwork must provide a report to CSUN, in-person or through email, detailing the number of students assisted by these funds and where additional resources or assistance are needed.
 - i. Report shall consist of the DREAMzone training content presented, as well as any information related to the audience demographics, total number of students and DREAMzone presentations, and any collaborations with community and campus partners.
 - 2. CSUN's name and/or logo shall be prominently displayed on Presentations.
- B. All money disbursed towards the DACA Renewal program (\$10,000) must be used for the purpose of paying for DACA Renewal applications for those that qualify for a fee waiver.
- C. It is the responsibility of the current Chair of the University Initiatives Committee to contact the DREAMzone program prior to March 31st of each fiscal year to present them with the most recent copy of their sponsorship.
- D. All funds not expended by UndocuNetwork for any and all purposes outlined within this chapter shall be returned to the CSUN Sponsorship Budget on or before June 30 of each fiscal year.
