Synopsis

Marijuana is now legal in almost all of our states. How much do we know about its potency, use, and adverse effects on the oral mucosa and dentition? This course is designed to give you a working knowledge of how people use marijuana, how it affects their physical and mental health, and what we need to know as dental health practitioners to help our patients realize the up- and downsides of marijuana use. We will discuss the basic history, method of use, myths, and provide a general knowledge of this complex and ever changing topic.

Refund & Cancellation

You may register up to the date of the course if space is available.
