




## **Election 2016: State Are Polls Off**




Arrows show simple average of state polls conducted in the three weeks before Election Day in states with at least three polls, compared with the projected final election result.

## **Election 2016: Results**

## For Trump:

- Elected the 45<sup>th</sup> U.S. President
- Will Win 306 Electoral Votes
- Largest EV Win Since Bush in 1988
- For Clinton:
  - Wins the Popular Vote by 1.8 Million
  - By Wider % Kennedy (60) Nixon (68)
  - Dems Win 6 of Last 7 Popular Votes

## **Election 2016: How Trump Won**

- Blue Rustbelt States Swing Red:
  - Michigan, Wisconsin, Pennsylvania
  - -46 Electoral Votes & 28.5 Mil. People
  - Trump's Margin About 100,000 Votes
- At the County Level:
  - Reps Surge in Non-Metro Counties
  - Dems Fade in Big Metro Counties
- · Gore, Kerry, & Obama Won 3 States

### **Election 2016: Mountain West**

- The Southern Mountain West:
  - Hold Solid for the Democrats
  - Closer Races than 2012 in CO and NV
  - But also Closer in AZ—A Red State
- In Nevada:
  - Dems Gain 2 Reps & Hold Senate Seat
  - Dems Gain Nevada Assembly/Senate
- Ds Wins Every State in Pacific Time

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#### The Mountain West Swing Region After 2016

Fading, Emerging, and Future "Blue Wall" States

Solid Blue Wall States: CA (55), CT (7), DC (3), DE (3), IL (20), HI (4), ME (4), MD (10), NJ (14), NY (29), RI (4), VT (3), OR (7), WA (12) = 175 EVs (All Dem Wins After 1988)

Fading Blue Wall States: MI (16), MN (10), PA (20), WI (10) = 56 EVs (All States Within 2% Spread in 2016)

Emerging Blue Wall States: CO (9), NV (6), NM (5), VA (13) = 33EVs (All States Won by Dems Last 3 Elections)

Future Blue Wall States: AZ (11), FL (29), NC (15) = 55 EVs (All States with 5 % Spread in 2016)
