



## ABOUT NSC

Nevada State College is the only comprehensive four-year public college in the state of Nevada. The college emphasizes high-quality instruction, exemplary service, engaging learning experiences, and innovation as a means to more efficient, effective outcomes in all corners of the campus. Committed to fostering a personal learning environment, students are taught by faculty who serve as mentors and guides in classrooms with an average size of only 27 students.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

### Freshman

A student can be admitted as a freshman to NSC, by one of the following paths: A standard Nevada high school diploma with a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale and completion of the following courses:

- 4 years of English
- 3 years of Mathematics (Algebra 1 or higher)
- 2 years of Science (with at least one lab science)
- 3 years of Social Studies

Students who hold a GED or completed high school through home schooling may have other criteria for admittance.

### Transfer

Admission to NSC as a transfer student will be based on the students' collegiate academic record. An applicant must have a minimum of 12 transferable credits from a two or four-year college or university with a cumulative grade point average of 2.0. Courses completed at other institutions will be evaluated on a course by course basis at the time of admission. If the applicant has an overall grade point average of 2.0 or above but completed less than 12 transferable credits, freshmen admission requirements must be satisfied.

## FINANCIAL AID

### FAFSA

To apply for financial aid complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid at [fafsa.gov](http://fafsa.gov) beginning January 1 and list NSC's school code 041143. Although students may apply at any time during the semester, those intending to use financial aid to meet tuition due dates should have all requested paperwork turned in to the financial aid office no later than 6 weeks prior to the semester deadline for payment. Students should also complete the NSC Scholarship application between December 15 and April 15 at [nsc.edu/finaid](http://nsc.edu/finaid).


