Description: The Nevada Society of Professional Engineers offers one \$1,600 full-time (12+ credits) or two \$800 part-time (6-11 credits) scholarships for undergraduate students enrolled in the UNLV Howard R Hughes College of Engineering.

NSPE-NV Eligibility criteria: To be eligible to apply, you must:

- **1.** Be currently enrolled as an undergraduate major or pre-major in computer science, construction management or engineering at UNLV with a graduation date of **Fall 2019** or later.
- **2.** Have a cumulative UNLV GPA of 2.75 or higher, and not be on academic probation or suspension.
- 3. Be a student member of NSPE and active in the NSPE Student chapter. **Cost: \$0.**Please apply at https://www.nspe.org/membership/type-membership/student-membership

Application process: Submit the following materials in your application, assembled in this order:

- 1. The application form on the next page, completed with your information and the names of the ethics videos you will be viewing to discuss (See below for more information),
- 2. Unofficial copy of your UNLV transcript, obtained from your MyUNLV student center account, and
- **3.** A copy of the record from NSPE national of your student membership.

Electronically submit all your completed materials as an assembled PDF file to engineering.scholarship@unlv.edu by 5:00 PM on Friday, November 9, 2018. Late or incomplete applications will not be accepted.

Evaluation criteria: Prior academic performance, prior level of participation in student organizations related to professional activities (<u>if you are sophomore, junior, or senior, one of the student organizations must be the student chapter of NSPE</u>), and ability to answer questions coherently and knowledgeably if selected to participate in the inperson oral interview phase on the topics listed below.

Ethics Videos: Students are required to identify any two of the following eight videos that they will watch in preparation for the oral interview phase of the scholarship process. Each of these videos discusses some current or historical topic where engineering ethics in some way impacts the discussion.
