Financial Aid & Scholarships

How to Pay your Tuition & Fees Bill

Notification of tuition and fees will be sent via email to your student's Rebelmail account. They can view their current account balance by logging into their MyUNLV account at my.unlv.nevada.edu.

Students should join the QLess virtual line before going to the Cashiering & Student Accounts office. They can join the line by texting **CASHIERINGQ** to **702-710-0905** or visiting unlv.edu/rebelq.

The Cashiering & Student Accounts Office accepts the following forms of payment:

Credit or Debit Card

- Pay online with a credit or debit card by logging into your MyUNLV account
- Pay in person with a credit or debit card
- Pay by fax a completed Credit Card Authorization Form

Cash

Cash payments are not recommended; however, they can be made at the Cashiering & Student Accounts Office.

Check, Cashier's Check, or Money Order

Payments can be made by check, cashier's check, or money order through the Cashiering & Student Accounts Office or a drop box located in the Student Services Complex, Building A, 1st floor. All forms of payment should be made payable to the Board of Regents and should include the NSHE Student ID Number on the front.

Payment Plans

Payment plans become available once your student registers for classes. In MyUNLV, select My Account and Enroll in a Payment Plan. For important tuition payment deadlines, please visit unlv.edu/cashiering/pay.

Academic Success Center

Note: All medical records are confidential. Information will not be released to anyone without the student's written consent, except as required by law or in case of a life-threatening emergency. Students under the age of 18, by Nevada State Law, are minors and must have signed parental consent and release to obtain medical care. This must be on file at the Student Health Center prior to care being given. These forms are available upon request.

Counseling & Psychological Services

On-campus plans are purchased when students register for housing. Students living off-campus can also purchase meal plans at any time online or at the RebelCard Services Office in the Student Union.

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a federal law that protects student records privacy and disclosure rights. In compliance with FERPA, UNLV does not disclose personally identifiable information in student education records, except authorized by law. Parents and guardians requesting access to student academic and financial records may only do so after the student has permitted them through a third-party release.

Title IX Compliance
