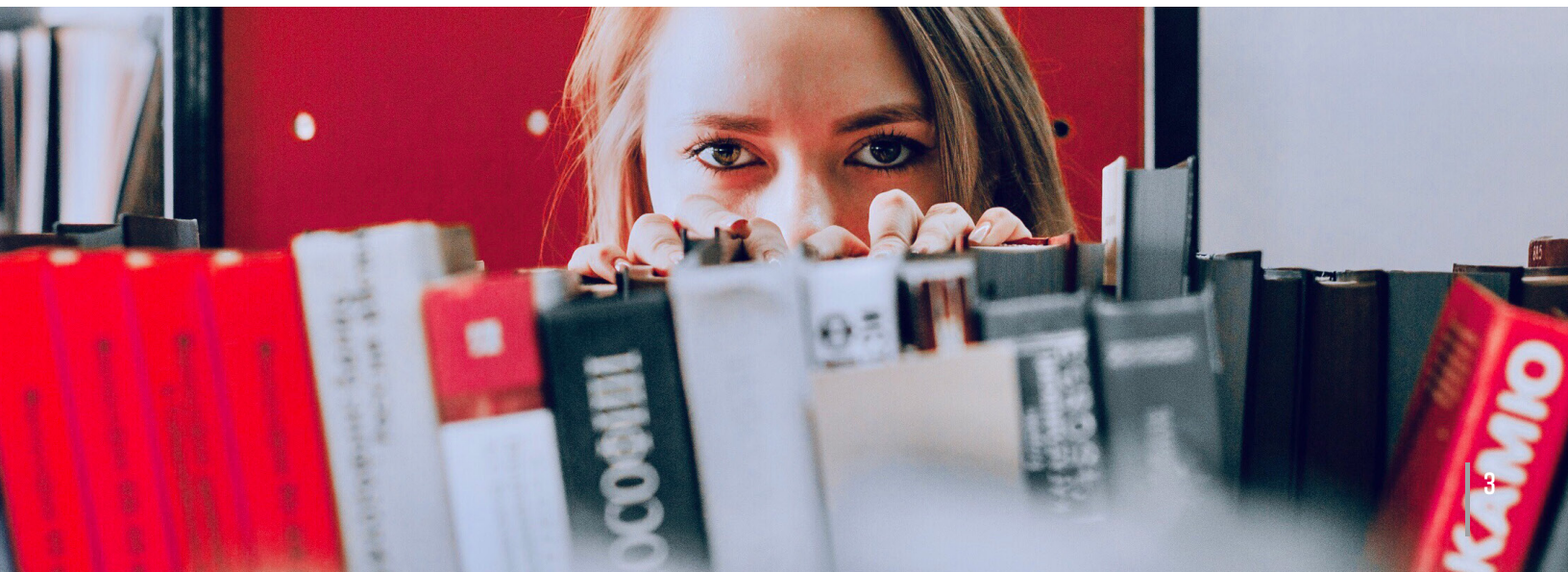

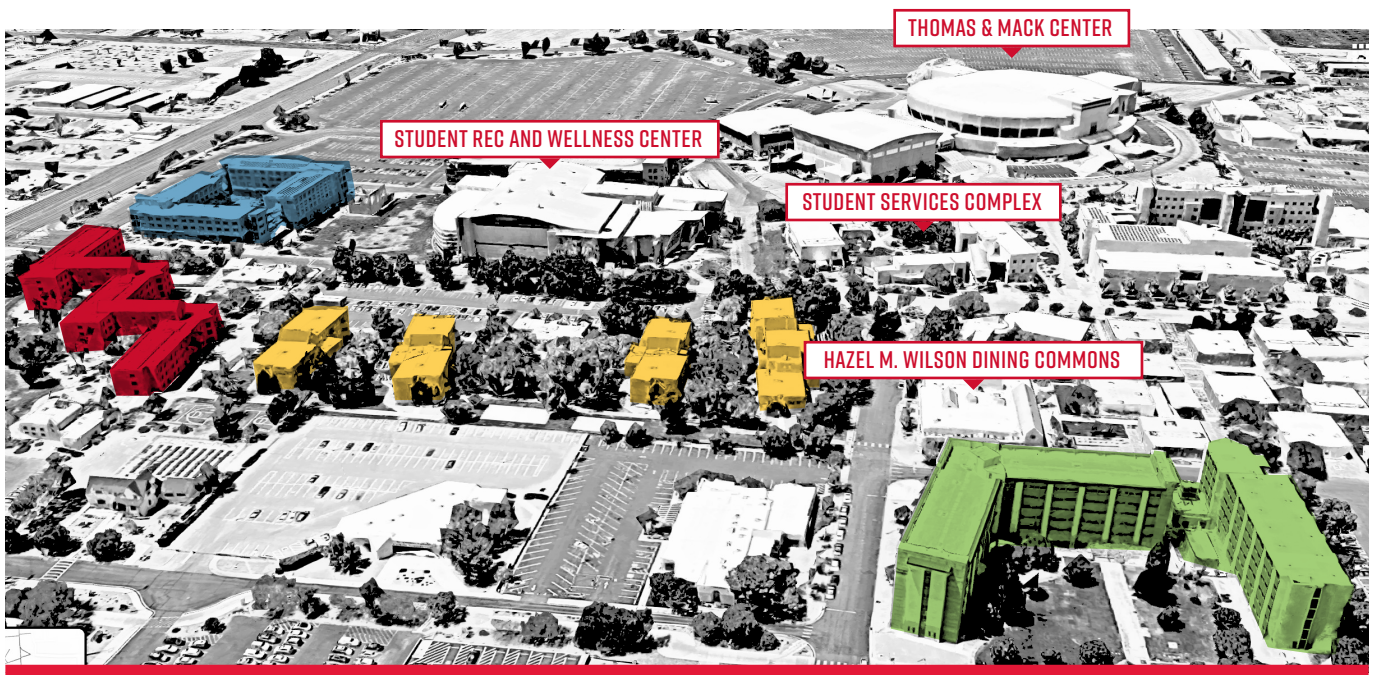

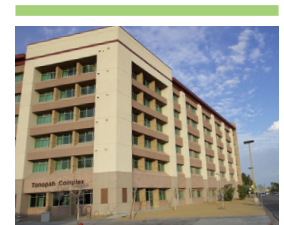

Dayton Complex

RESIDENCE HALL COMPLEXES

DAYTON COMPLEX

Dayton Complex is reserved for approximately 500 first-year freshmen students and offers double and triple room configurations. Dayton Complex is located along Tropicana Avenue and just steps from the Student Recreation and Wellness Center.

SOUTH COMPLEX

South Complex is home to 500 first-year and upper-class students in double rooms. This complex is comprised of three different buildings of Boyd Hall, Rodman Hall, and Williams Hall. South Complex is located along Tropicana Ave and is adjacent to Dayton Complex.

TONOPAH COMPLEX

Tonopah Complex is located in the center of campus, just steps away from the Dining Commons and Student Union. It is comprised of Tonopah Center, Tonopah North, and Tonopah South with 600 first-year and upper-class students in double and triple room configurations.

UPPERCLASS COMPLEX

Upperclass Complex is comprised of 4 buildings, B Hall, C Hall, Faiman Hall, and Hughes Hall, consisting of 200 upper-class (post first-year) students in deluxe single rooms, each with a separate living/study area and a full-size bed. Each building also has a full-size kitchen for resident use on the first floor. Upperclass Complex is located next door to the Dining Commons and the Student Recreation and Wellness Center.



ALL WOMEN

This community is available to any female student who chooses to live in a women-only living environment.

Location: Tonopah Complex

ENGINEERING

The Howard R. Hughes College of Engineering floor supports Engineering Majors through intentional outreach and efforts such as a dedicated computer lab on the floor outfitted with commonly-used software programs for Engineering students. The Engineering floor provides a cohort of future engineers to live, learn, problem solve, and socialize in a supportive environment.

Location: Tonopah Complex

GRADUATE/23 AND OLDER

This community is composed of students who are either at least 23 years of age or pursuing graduate degrees at UNLV. This floor is intended to be a study-intensive, upper-class environment that will assist in supporting the academic goals of a student population that maintains multiple life commitments and varying schedules.

Location: Upperclass Complex

FINE ARTS

Students majoring in UNLV's College of Fine Arts can opt to live on the Fine Arts floor. Supported by the College of Fine Arts, residents can network with other Fine Arts students, participate in programs designed for and by Fine Arts students, and have access to a baby grand piano in a designed music room. This community offers a great opportunity for those with a love of visual and performing arts to live, dine and study together.

Location: Tonopah Comple

HONORS

Freshmen Students who are enrolled in the Honors College at UNLV are eligible to live in this community. This is a community of peers who take some of the same courses and can assist each other in studying for courses together.

Location: Dayton Complex



HOSPITALITY

This community is designed for hospitality majors wishing to live and work with others who are also enrolled in the William F. Harrah College of Hospitality. Participants interact with faculty members in the hospitality college through programs that include mentoring opportunities, finding employment in the hospitality industry, internship opportunities, study groups, social events, and other leadership programs.

Location: Dayton Complex

HOWELL TOWN

Named after John Howell, the first African American to own land in Clark County, Nevada, Howell Town aims to build a community that empowers and supports Black students at UNLV. Members of this residential community will take an African American and African Diaspora Studies class together and will have opportunities to participate in culturally relevant programs, field trips, community service, professional development, and make connections with faculty and staff.

Location: South Complex

STONEWALL SUITES

This community is designed to provide a safe, comfortable, and educational living and learning environment for LGBTQ+ students and their allies, as well as being an inclusive environment for students who identify as any gender. All suites in the Stonewall community are gender-inclusive; students may choose to live with other students of any gender. Students living in this community will have opportunities to further develop their identity through ongoing programming and connections to faculty, staff, and campus resources.

Location: South Complex

STUDY-INTENSIVE

This community environment is a popular offering among many of our residents. Although the study-intensive floor remains a lively and fun place to live, residents who select this floor generally place a greater focus on their academics. Residents on the study-intensive floor enjoy 24-hour courtesy hours and agree on their quiet hours to create an environment conducive to studying.

Location: Tonopah Complex

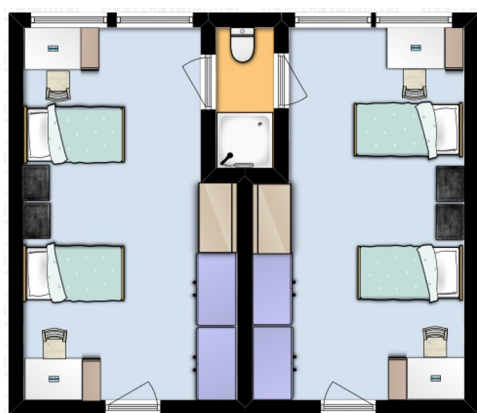


RESIDENCE HALL ACCOMMODATIONS

Housing Application

UNLV Housing's online application is the fast and convenient way to apply for university housing. Housing assignments are made on a first come, first served basis. The earlier you apply, the greater likelihood you will receive your preferred community, floor, and/or room type.

THE FALL APPLICATION OPENS ON DECEMBER 1

Application Fee & Deposits

There is a \$125 non-refundable Housing Application Fee that is required before the application is completed. If you need financial assistance for the Housing Application Fee, please contact your Admissions Counselor.

There is no additional deposit needed to secure your space for the upcoming academic year!

Housing Portal

The **Housing Portal** is your online resource for living on campus. After you have been accepted to UNLV, you will receive an email to set up your ACE account or visit ace.unlv.edu to get started. You will not be able to log into the Housing Portal to apply for housing until your ACE account has been set up. After your account has been set up, wait 48-72 hours for the Housing Portal to recognize your credentials. You will use the Housing Portal to access the online application, submit roommate requests, and select your specific room for the upcoming academic year.

Roommate Matching

JUNE 1 - JUNE 15

UNLV Housing partners with Compatibility®, a Roommate Matching program to help you match with potential roommates. You will answer questions about yourself, view all of your potential matches based on compatibility rank, and communicate with other incoming residents to determine your best roommate match. We will update your housing profile when you have successfully made a mutual match with another resident.

If you would like to request a specific roommate, you can do so through the Housing Portal by creating a roommate group. Under the tab, Roommate Selection, you will enter in your roommate's name in the Simple Roommate Search option. Once the roommate you requested logs into their Housing Portal, they will need to accept your request for the match to be complete. You can request up to 3 other students to fill a full suite.

***Roommate Requests are not a guarantee and are based on room availability during Room Selection.*

Room Selection

JUNE 15 - JUNE 30

Residents can select their preferred community, floor, or room type based on what is available during Room Selection through their Housing Portal. All floor plans for each building and floor will be available to better assist you in selecting your desired room. Room Selection priority numbers will be given out in order of application received.

In June, you will receive an email with your priority number and associated selection start time. If you have successfully matched with any roommates and/or suitemates, whoever has the highest priority number will be able to select the room and/or suite for your entire roommate group.

Room Checklist

- Clothing (*remember it gets cold in Las Vegas*)

- Floor Lamp (*There is no overhead lighting in UCC*)

- Candles, incense, or items with open flames
- Electric blankets

Purchase before August 5, and your package will be ready for you in your room by Move-In Day! Mini-Fridge/Microwave Combo

Want a mini-fridge and a microwave? Get a combination of the two in just one appliance! UNLV Housing does not allow personal microwaves except for microwaves that are part of a fridge/microwave combination. Many companies offer the mini-fridge and microwave combination for purchase, and you can have it sent directly to the Residence Halls after August 15. The specifications are 3.2 cubic feet for the fridge and 700 watts or less for the microwave.



GET INVOLVED!

RESIDENT ASSISTANTS (RAS)

Each floor has a designated Resident Assistant that has been hired and trained to be your in-hall support and resource. Part of your RA's responsibility is to develop a relationship with each resident on their floor and meet with each resident individually. Resident Assistants attend a class during the Spring Semester to better prepare them for your arrival. If you are interested in being a Resident Assistant, applications will be available in October.

UNLV RESIDENCE HALL ASSOCIATION (RHA)


RHA plans fun activities for multiple identities of students living on campus, advocates on behalf of UNLV residents to administration, and creates stronger community ties through leadership conferences. Some of their notable events are RHA Block Party, Undie Run, Fall Festival, and Big Game Sunday. RHA meets on a weekly basis to hear feedback from residents, and attendance is highly encouraged to have your voice heard!

COMPLEX LEADERSHIP COUNCIL

The Leadership Councils plan complex wide events such as the annual "Boo Bash" Halloween celebration in Tonopah and the annual "Daytona Beach" party in Dayton. They also serve as an advocacy group for the residents of each individual complex. Leadership Council Presidents are elected by residents of individual complexes each spring semester except for Dayton Complex. The Dayton Complex President will be elected during September. Leadership Council membership is made up of all residents of the complex. Leadership Council is a great way to meet people in your complex, have some fun, and start building leadership skills.

NATIONAL RESIDENCE HALL HONORARY (NRHH)

The Rho Epsilon Beta chapter of the National Residence Hall Honorary (NRHH) advocates for the interests and welfare of residence hall students, while also providing opportunities for their personal growth and development. NRHH recognizes the accomplishments of individuals who have contributed to the advancement of university housing residence halls and provides different service opportunities. This honorary is for students who have earned a GPA within the top one percent among those living on campus.

ADDITIONAL HOUSING INFORMATION

APPLICATION CANCELLATION

As a new resident of UNLV Housing, you can cancel your application with no penalty by July 1. You can cancel your application through the Housing Portal by reassessing your completed application and selecting to cancel/withdraw your application.

After July 1, there will be a \$500 cancellation fee to cancel your contract and/or room assignment. If you are no longer attending UNLV, you have until August 1 to cancel without a penalty, after August 1, the \$500 cancellation fee will apply. You will no longer be able to cancel your application online, so you will need to contact our office at 702-895-3489 or housing@unlv.edu to receive a Release of Contract Form.

You must cancel your contract to be released of all contract obligations even if you are no longer attending UNLV. You may be subject to higher cancellation or no-show charges.

CONTRACT DATES

The UNLV Housing and Dining Hall Contract is for the entire academic year of Fall and Spring. The specific hall opening and closure dates can be found online at [UNLV.edu/housing/resources](https://unlv.edu/housing/resources). There are additional charges to stay over Winter Break or Summer Break.

RESIDENTIAL LIFE MEAL PLANS

All residents are required to have a meal plan. Residential meal plans are offered on a semester basis and include meals at the Dining Commons (DC) plus Dining Dollars that may be used at food outlets on campus. You will select your meal plan during the application process. After the semester has started, you may change your meal plan one time per semester through the end of the third week of classes. A processing fee will be charged to change your meal plan during the semester.

PAYMENTS

All Residential Life Room Fees and Residential Life Meal Plan Fees will be paid for through your MyUNLV account. Once a room selection has been made in July, the charges will be reflected on your account. All fees are due the Friday before the semester starts. Financial Aid or payment plans can be applied toward your housing and dining charges.

PARKING PERMITS

UNLV offers parking lots convenient to all resident hall complexes. There are two residential parking lots – one located by South Complex along Tropicana Avenue and one located by Upperclass Complex adjacent to the Student Wellness and Recreation Center. Resident parking permits will be available for purchase starting on Move-In Day. UNLV Parking Services will be available at different complexes during Move-In Day to sell Resident parking permits. REQUESTS FOR EARLY ARRIVAL

Residents may request an early arrival to move in before Move-In Day. Early Arrival starts the Sunday before Move-In Day, and there is an additional fee to arrive early. Early Arrival requests must be received by the Housing and Residential Life Office no later than 10 business days before Move-In Day to be considered. Please contact our office for more information.
