

MHA Entrance Exam Policy & Tips

FAQs:

Which exam is required for the MHA application?

The Department of Health Care Administration & Policy accepts the GMAT or GRE.

Can the exam requirement be waived?

Exemptions are available for those who took graduate entry tests (e. g. MCAT, LSAT) or have a terminal degree (e. g., PhD, JD, MD, DNP).

Does the GRE or GMAT have to be taken prior to applying to and starting the MHA Program?

You can apply to and start the MHA Program without taking the exam, if you meet all other entrance qualifications, and you will be granted provision acceptance to the program. You will then need to take the exam by the end of your first semester and your provisional status will be removed. Preparing over a 2-6 month period is highly recommended to achieve the best score.

Is a minimum score required on the exam and how does UNLV receive my results?

No. Your score is evaluated in concert with the other merits of your application, including your undergraduate GPA, your work experience and personal statement, and your recommendation letters. When taking the exam, you will be asked which schools you want your results sent to.
