

**Counselor Education Program at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas
MA and MS Outcomes Report for CACREP Accredited Programs**

September 2018

The following information was captured on the CACREP annual Vital Statistics survey for the Counselor Education Program accredited at the University of Nevada, Las Vegas. The information we share in this form has been compiled from a number of sources, and represents our best effort to capture data for accreditation purposes. On an annual basis, the Counselor Education Program obtains data from students, graduates, site supervisors, employers, and institutional sources to inform us about our program standards. The information presented below is for the 2018 academic year.

Clinical Mental Health Counseling—MA

- This program requires the completion of 60 credit hours, including 100 practicum hours and 600 clinical internship hours.
- 51 students are currently enrolled in this program.
- 14 students graduated from this degree program in the past year.
- We estimate the completion rate of students from this program at approximately 96%.
- During the past year, we estimate the licensure/certification pass rate at approximately 97%.
- Of those students seeking employment, we estimate approximately 97% gained employment.

School Counseling—MS

- This program requires the completion of 48 credit hours, including 100 practicum hours and 600 school internship hours.
- 44 students are currently enrolled in this program.
- 12 students graduate from this degree program in the past year.
- We estimate the completion rate of students from this program at approximately 93%.
- During the past year, we estimate the licensure/certification pass rate at approximately 97%.
- Of those students seeking employment, we estimate approximately 97% gained employment.

Master's Level Program Important Data

- The program typically receives between 100-140 applications during an admission cycle. The demographic make-up of the applicants varies during each admission cycle.
- Approximately 90% of the students currently enrolled in the program are female and 10% percent male.
- The demographic make-up of the current student body is as follows: 40% White, 22% Hispanic or Latino, 18% Black or African-American, 6% Asian, 7% Multiracial, 1% Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander.
