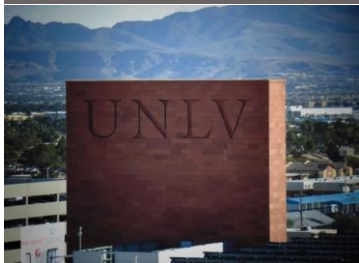

- * Start Up/Run – start and work normally

- * Batteries – no corrosion, proper fluid level, and proper charge.
